Peer Mentoring Program Salem Basketball Officials Association

Purpose:

- 1. To guide and support new, young, inexperienced, and transfer officials
- 2. To aide in the introduction of new and transfer officials into the SBOA
- 3. To improve referee retention, communication, and on-court skill

Eligibility:

- 1. First to third year officials.
 - a. Each first- and second-year official will receive a mentor. Each third year official will receive a mentor if requested.
- 2. A "transfer" is an official from another high school basketball officials' association new to SBOA.
 - a. A transfer official will receive a mentor if requested and at the discretion of the EC.
- 3. A "mentor" is a varsity level official with at least 5-years' experience and who has been approved by the SBOA Executive Committee.

Requirements:

- 1. Be willing to fulfill the role of Mentor or Mentee.
- 2. At least one contact per week between the Mentor and Mentee (email, phone, or in person).

Mentee Responsibilities:

- 1. Contact mentor at least once a week via phone, email, or in person.
- 2. Ask questions of mentor.
- 3. Be receptive with information mentor has to share.

Mentor Role and Responsibilities:

- 1. Being Encouraging, supportive, and approachable.
- 2. Motivate mentee to improve knowledge base and skills. Facilitate questions about rules and game situations.
- 3. Share personal experiences, successes, and challenges and how you've overcome them.
- 4. Maintain professionalism through on- and off-court conduct.
- 5. Provide feedback on how to adjust and improve this program.
- 6. Send a brief summary of interactions to program coordinator by the end of the regular season.

Suggestions for Guiding Mentee include:

- 1. Helping to locate official's uniform and accessories.
- 2. Introducing and answering questions relating to the Arbiter.
- 3. Discussing the useful pages on SBOA's website (eg. Mileage Adjustment page, meeting dates, ejection form).
- 4. At mentee's request, summarizing what took place at SBOA meetings.
- 5. Ask about mentee's short (season) and long term goals.
- 6. Assisting Mentee with game site directions and specifics (locker room location, parking location, etc.).
- 7. If able, watch at least one game throughout the year.
- 8. If schedules permit, working a pre-season scrimmage or regular season game (middle school or high school).
